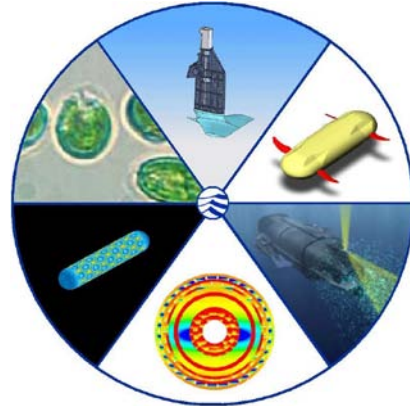

Mr. Pullar is the President and owner of Pullar Consulting, a Service-Disabled, Veteran Owned Small Business (SDVOB) focused on providing research and development and acquisition management services to defense and homeland security sectors through a network of consulting assets. In July 2009, Pullar Consulting was merged with RMGS, Inc.

Prior to establishing Pullar Consulting, Mr. Pullar served as the Vice President, Division Director of Trident Systems, Inc. During that time he increased division resources from \$1.5M (CY05) to \$10M+ (CY07); personnel from 15 to 49 mechanical, electrical, firmware, and software engineers; Program Managers from 2 to 5. He was responsible for technical, administrative, and profit/loss responsibility of 8 contracts including multiple technology projects in areas of wireless networking, sensors, UAV payloads, and situational awareness tools.

Prior to joining Trident Systems, Inc, CAPT Walt Pullar (USN, Retired) completed a distinguished 27-year career as a SEAL in the U.S. Navy. His operational tours included all operational SEAL leadership assignments up to the rank of Captain and his career culminated with two Commodore assignments. He served as Deputy Commander for the Naval Special Warfare Task Force that planned for and led the initial combat operations in Operation Iraqi Freedom. In addition to his operational experience, he gained over 10 years of experience in acquisition, served as a USSOCOM Program Executive Officer for Special Programs, and as a Program Manager for USSOCOM and the US Navy. He was certified as a Level III Acquisition Professional. While at USSOCOM, CAPT Pullar led two teams and participated in two other groups that were presented David Packard Acquisition Awards.

Mr. Pullar has a Bachelor's degree from Duke University and a Masters in Procurement from Webster University.
